Visitor Accommodation

Visitor accommodation has been built into general inpatient rooms at the Royal Adelaide Hospital (RAH), enabling a relative or carer to stay overnight when it is in the patient's best interests.

Each general inpatient room features a visitor bed with linen packs available to hire. Proceeds from the hire go to the RAH Research Fund.

These expanded provisions will enable more carers and family members to remain with their loved ones. For those who need to stay offsite while loved ones are in care, there are a range of options to consider.

These include staying with friends and family or using offsite subsidised accommodation facilities that cater specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

The accommodation providers listed in this brochure offer Aboriginal people culturally appropriate and affordable accommodation in safe and comfortable environments.

Please note, if you do decide to stay with friends or family, you will need to arrange your own transport to and from the hospital.

Do you live more than 100Km away from the nearest specialist?

Regional and remote patients may be eligible for financial assistance towards cost of travel and accommodation under their State or Territory Patient Assistance Transport Scheme (PATS). To find out more for your state or territory refer "Need more information or support?" section of this brochure.

Accommodation for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients and families

The Mulgunya, Luprina and Nindee hostels are operated by Aboriginal Hostels Limited.

These facilities provide short-term accommodation for Aboriginal people who need to be away from home to access life-changing education, employment, health and other services.

Acceptance criteria applies.

Kanggawodli is an Aboriginal-managed SA Health hostel that provides in-reach primary health, wellbeing and case management services for Aboriginal people (and their escort) who are in Adelaide for specialist care.

This service provides short term crisis accommodation for Aboriginal people who are transient or at risk of rough sleeping. Provides 24-hour short term accommodation at Hendon and transitional housing in up to four houses in northern Adelaide.

The Royal Adelaide Hospital provides an Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Health and Wellbeing Hub to support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients, their families and carers.

Our Aboriginal Health Team will support Aboriginal patients and their escorts with transport and temporary accommodation arrangements.

The Aboriginal Hub is centrally located within the Royal Adelaide Hospital's main entrance area on level 3 (wayfinding 3A690).

Interpreters are available for Aboriginal languages. Please feel free to ask about this service.


